

Family Eucharist for Easter Season

Welcome to Holy Nativity Church in the Parish of Mixenden and Illingworth!

Everyone is welcome here.

Easter is the most important festival in the Church's year. Through Holy Week we have followed Jesus on his journey to Jerusalem. We have shared in the last supper and we have marked his death on Good Friday. On Easter day we celebrate Jesus' resurrection.

During the service we will sing songs of celebration and praise to God who raised Jesus from the dead. We will gather around the font and renew our baptism vows. We will also shared bread and wine together as we celebrate the Eucharist.

The Eucharist is a 'sacrament': it is a visible sign of God's love.

The words for the minister are in normal type and the congregation responds with the words in **bold type**.

Hymns or songs may be sung.

All Glory to you O Lord At the end of the reading



This is the Gospel of the Lord.

All Praise to you O Christ

Talk

There may be some form of teaching

The creed may be used

Let us declare our faith in the resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ.

All Christ died for our sins in accordance with the Scriptures; he was buried; he was raised to life on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures; afterwards he appeared to his followers, and to all the apostles: this we have received, and this we believe.

Amen.

The Eucharistic prayer continues until


... and be welcomed at your feast in heaven where all creation worships you, Father, Son and Holy Spirit:

All Lord our hearts hunger for you; Give us this bread always.


Giving of Communion


