

Celtic Advent

Welcome to Holy Nativity Church in the Parish of Mixenden and Illingworth!

Everyone is welcome here.

Advent is a time for Christians to prepare for Christmas. It is a time of reflection as we bring our lives before God.

This is a quiet service based around the music of the Northumbria community, a monastic community in the North of England. This isn't supposed to be formal, it is a fun way of worshipping God with our voices.

The words for the minister are in normal type and the congregation responds with the words in **bold type**.



The Blessing of Light

We have come to seek You

We have come to seek you, O God, Just as we are, we come. We have come to be sought by You, Just as we are we come. (repeat).

The light and peace of Jesus Christ be with you **All** And also with you.

The president greets the people

The officiant then lights the Paschal Candle and says the following prayer.

Blessed are you, Lord God, Creator of day and night: to you be praise and glory for ever. As darkness falls you renew your promise to reveal among us the light of your presence.

By the light of Christ, your living Word, dispel the darkness of our hearts that we may walk as children of light and sing your praise throughout the world. Blessed be God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit:

All Blessed be God forever

Please light your own candles.

During Psalm 141 the officiant puts on incense.

O Lord, I call to you; come to me quickly; • hear my voice when I cry to you.

Set a watch before my mouth, O Lord, • and guard the door of my lips;

Let not my heart incline to any evil thing; • let me not be occupied in wickedness with evildoers.

But my eyes are turned to you, Lord God; • in you I take refuge; do not leave me defenceless.

This opening prayer may be said

That this evening may be holy, good and peaceful, let us pray with one heart and mind.

Silence is kept.

As our evening prayer rises before you, O God, so may your mercy come down upon us to cleanse our hearts and set us free to sing your praise now and for ever.

All Amen.


